

Notice About 2026 Tax Rates

Property tax rates in COUNTY OF VICTORIA.

This notice concerns the 2026 property tax rates for COUNTY OF VICTORIA. This notice provides information about two tax rates used in adopting the current tax year's tax rate. The no-new-revenue tax rate would impose the same amount of taxes as last year if you compare properties taxed in both years. In most cases, the voter-approval tax rate is the highest tax rate a taxing unit can adopt without holding an election. In each case, these rates are calculated by dividing the total amount of taxes by the current taxable value with adjustments as required by state law. The rates are given per \$100 of property value.

This year's no-new-revenue tax rate	\$0.3790/\$100
This year's voter-approval tax rate	\$0.4456/\$100

Voter-Approval Tax Rate Adjustments

Indigent Defense Compensation Expenditures

The COUNTY OF VICTORIA spent \$1,795,390 from July 1, 2025 to June 30, 2026 to provide appointed counsel for indigent individuals, less the amount of state grants received by the county. In the preceding year, the county spent \$1,734,284 for indigent defense compensation expenditures. The amount of increase above last year's indigent defense expenditures is \$61,106. This increased the voter-approval rate by 0.0006/\$100 the increased expenditures.

This notice contains a summary of actual no-new-revenue and voter-approval calculations as certified by Ashley Hernandez, Victoria County Tax Assessor Collector on 08/06/2026 .
